<u>Vision:</u> A community that fosters education from birth through high school to provide a basis for individual and social development.

Goal: United Way will partner with evidence-based programs that are most effective in helping children from birth through high school succeed in education and in life.

Priority Populations:

While individuals and families in need may exist beyond what is noted. United Way will first invest resources in the population identified below:

- Individuals and families (households) at or below 200% FPL (Federal Poverty Level) and ALICE* (Asset Limited Income Constrained Employed) thresholds.
- Individuals and families for which various social determinants of health** are barriers to their success.

<u>Priority #1:</u> Provide children in priority populations with programs and services that prepare them to enter kindergarten developmentally on track and ready to succeed.

Ages: Birth to Kindergarten

Strategies:

- A. Equip families with the tools, knowledge and skills to enrich childhood development and reduce the incidence of child maltreatment.
- B. Support quality childcare.

Priority #2: Provide children in priority populations with programs that support their path to academic success.

Ages: Kindergarten through High School

Strategies:

- A. Equip families with the tools, knowledge, and skills to enrich childhood development and reduce the incidence of child maltreatment.
- B. Support quality childcare.
- C. Support programs that provide opportunities to help children achieve age-appropriate reading proficiency.
- D. Connect students to before, during, and after school programming to support educational success and overall development (e.g., tutoring, mentoring, and homework assistance).
- E. Support multi-generational educational opportunities
- F. Support programs that help students develop skills to graduate on time and be prepared for success after high school.
